SUPPLEMENTATION

PREFACE

The Town of Basalt, a statutory town, has published its Municipal Code in a format which features the following:

The *Table of Contents* is the table containing each chapter and article title, with reference to page location. Preceding each chapter is a chapter table of contents, also identifying each article by the subject name provided.

The *two-place section numbering system* places the chapter number first, followed by a hyphen and section number. This two-place system is simplified by the elimination of article numbering. Each section may be cited by the chapter and section numbers which, together with reserved section numbers, are in sequence within each chapter.

The *open chapter and page numbering system* creates reserved chapter and page numbers for expansion or revision of the code without undue complication when changes are made to the code by supplementation.

The *Disposition of Ordinances Table* identifies the source for the contents of the code. This table provides ordinance numbers in chronological order and location by section number for the present code contents. Thus, if there is interest in determining whether an ordinance, or a portion thereof, is contained within the code, the Disposition of Ordinances Table will provide that information. The *Table of Up-to-Date Pages* lists all of the current pages through the most recent supplementation.

The *Index* provides references by common and legal terminology to the appropriate code sections. Cross references are provided with the Index when appropriate.

Supplements to the code provide regular updating of the code to maintain it as a current compilation of all the legislation which has general and continuing effect. Without regular supplementation, the code would soon lose its usefulness as a complete source of the general law of the municipality. Supplementation is accomplished by the periodic publication of additions and amendments to the code.

ORDINANCE NO. 22
SERIES OF 1991

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF BASALT, ADOPTING AND ENACTING A NEW CODE FOR THE TOWN OF BASALT; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF CERTAIN ORDINANCES NOT INCLUDED THEREIN; PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR THE MANNER OF AMENDING SUCH CODE; AND PROVIDING WHEN SUCH CODE AND THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE.

Be It Ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Basalt, Colorado:

Section 1. The code entitled *Municipal Code of the Town of Basalt* published by Colorado Code Publishing Company, consisting of Chapters 1 through 18, is adopted.

Section 2. All ordinances of a general and permanent nature enacted on or before December 30, 1991, and not included in the Code or recognized and continued in force by reference therein are repealed.

Section 3. The repeal established in the foregoing section shall not be construed to revive any ordinance or part thereof that had been previously repealed by any ordinance which is repealed by this Ordinance.

Section 4. The following codes were adopted by reference and incorporated in the Municipal Code of the Town of Basalt. One (1) copy is on file in the Town Clerk's office:

(1) The *Model Traffic Code for Colorado Municipalities*, 1977 edition, published by the State Department of Highways, as adopted and amended in Section 8-1 *et seq*;

(2) The *Uniform Fire Code*, 1988 edition, published by the Western Fire Chiefs Association and International Conference of Building Officials, as adopted and amended in Section 18-61 *et seq*;

Section 5. The following codes are hereby adopted by reference and incorporated in the Municipal Code of the Town of Basalt. One (1) copy is on file in the Town Clerk's office:

(1) The *Uniform Building Code*, 1991 edition, published by the International Conference of Building Officials, as adopted and amended in Section 18-1 *et seq*;

(2) The *Uniform Building Code Standards*, 1991 edition, published by the International Conference of Building Officials, as adopted and amended in Section 18-1 *et seq*;

(3) The *Uniform Mechanical Code*, 1991 edition, published by the International Association of Plumbing and Mechanical Officials, as adopted and amended in Section 18-1 *et seq*;

(4) The *Uniform Code for the Abatement of Dangerous Buildings*, 1991 edition, published by the International Conference of Building Officials, as adopted in Section 18-1;

(5) The *Uniform Plumbing Code*, 1991 edition, published by the International Association of Plumbing and Mechanical Officials, as adopted and amended in Section 18-1 *et seq*;

(6) The *National Electrical Code*, 1990 edition, published by the National Fire Protection Association, as adopted and amended in Section 18-1 *et seq*;

Section 6. The penalties provided by the Municipal Code of the Town of Basalt are hereby adopted as follows:

(1) **Sec. 1-82. General penalty for violations.**

Unless otherwise specifically provided, any person violating any provisions or failing to comply with any of the mandatory requirements of the ordinances of the Town shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. Any person convicted of a misdemeanor under the ordinances of the Town shall be punished by a fine of not more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) or by imprisonment for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment except as hereinafter provided in Section 1-83. Each such person shall be guilty of a separate offense for each and every day during any portion of which any violation of any provision of the ordinances of the Town is committed, continued or permitted by any such person, and he or she shall be punished accordingly.

(2) **Sec. 1-83. Application of penalties to juveniles and to convictions of lesser offense.**

Every person who, at the time of commission of the offense, was at least ten (10) but not yet eighteen (18) years of age, and who is subsequently convicted of or pleads guilty or nolo contendere to, a violation of any provision of this Chapter, shall be punished by a fine of not more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) per violation or count. Any voluntary plea of guilty or nolo contendere to the original charge or to a lesser or substituted charge shall subject the person so pleading to all fines and/or penalties applicable to the original charge.

(3) **Sec. 6-10. Delinquent charges. (Article I, Business Licenses)**

Any person failing to pay any license fee levied under this Article by January 31 shall thereafter be deemed delinquent and the license deemed expired. To renew the license, licensee shall be subject to a delinquent fee charge of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for each month thereof during which said fee is delinquent, assessed on the first day of the month, in addition to any other penalty which may be imposed for the violation of this Code.

(4) **Sec. 7-141. Dangerous and potentially dangerous dogs.**

(c) Any potentially dangerous dog as described in Section 7-131(24) that has caused no human injury or a domestic animal injury and has been found running at large may be impounded, and the owner shall be fined fifty dollars (\$50.00) for the first offense and one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) for the second offense. The third offense will result in a mandatory court appearance of the dog's owner.

(5) **Sec. 7-149. Penalties. (Article VII, Dogs)**

(a) Any person convicted of violating any provisions of this Article, which violation does not result in bodily injury to any person, shall be punished for such offense by imprisonment for not more than ninety (90) days or by a fine of not more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00), or by both such imprisonment and fine, plus the customary court costs as applicable.

(b) The following fines (penalty assessment), except those stated in Section 7-150, shall apply to any such violation and shall be applied either through the penalty assessment

procedure of Section 16-2-201, C.R.S., or by the court after conviction, in which case the court shall also assess the appropriate court costs:

- (1) First offense: Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).
- (2) Second offense: One hundred dollars (\$100.00).
- (3) Third offense: Two hundred dollars (\$200.00).
- (4) Fourth offense and any subsequent conviction: The court may impose a fine of up to the three hundred dollar (\$300.00) maximum or imprisonment in the county jail for not more than ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, for each separate offense.
- (5) Any violations of Sections 7-111 or 7-112 shall be subject to the following penalties, which shall be assessed at the discretion of the court within the limits set forth below:

- a. First offense within any one (1) year period, fifteen dollars (\$15.00) to fifty dollars (\$50.00).
- b. Second offense within any one (1) year period, thirty dollars (\$30.00) to one hundred dollars (\$100.00).
- c. Third offense within any one (1) year period, sixty dollars (\$60.00) to three hundred dollars (\$300.00).
- d. Fourth or subsequent offense, no less than one hundred twenty dollars (\$120.00) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) and a mandatory court appearance.

(h) Any violation of any provisions of this Article which results in bodily injury to any person or animal caused by a dog shall, upon conviction thereof, be punishable by a minimum fine of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) and imprisonment for three (3) months, or both, up to a maximum fine of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) and imprisonment for twelve (12) months.

(11) Article XXVII, Fine Schedule, is hereby created:

"ARTICLE XXVII

Fine Schedule

Except as may be otherwise provided, every person who is convicted of, who admits liability for, or against whom a judgment is entered for a violation of any provision of Section 1-1 to 20-19 shall be fined or penalized in accordance with the penalty schedule set forth below. These penalties shall apply whether the defendant acknowledges his guilt or liability or is found guilty by the court or otherwise has judgment entered against him. Penalties for violating specific actions shall be as follows:

(8) **Sec. 8-6. Violations and penalties. (Article I, Model Traffic Code)**

The following penalties, herewith set forth in full, shall apply to this Chapter:

(1) It is unlawful for any person to violate any of the provisions stated or adopted in this Chapter.

(2) Except as provided in Section 8-2(11) of this Code, every person convicted of a violation of any provision stated or adopted in this Chapter shall be punished by a fine not exceeding three hundred dollars (\$300.00).

(9) **Sec. 13-24. Inspections.**

Any authorized representative of the Water Department shall have the right to enter any property or building where water furnished by the Town is used, for the purpose of making an inspection of pipes, fixtures or appliances and for the further purpose of detecting and eliminating any alteration, connection to or disconnection from meters, wasting of water, improper or unauthorized use of water facility, installation of pipes or fixtures or other improper use of water. Property owners shall make access available during regular working hours to Water Department personnel within fifteen (15) days of notification. Failure to comply shall result in a penalty of fifty dollars (\$50.00) per quarter being added to owner's water bill and shall allow the Town to charge for the estimated usage of water, both at each billing period..

(10) **Sec. 13-31. Additional service or fixtures.**

(b) Any user, owner or occupant of a structure who installs or uses additional fixtures or plumbing services and does not report same shall be charged at double the ordinary rates for such fixtures or plumbing service for the period of time that such fixtures are in use and remain unreported, in addition to a penalty of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for each violation, such amount to be added onto and collected with the water bill at each billing period.

(11) **Sec. 16-268. Penalty for violations. (Article XIII, Zoning Administration and Enforcement)**

Failure to comply with all of the provisions of the Chapter, unless a variance has been authorized by the Board of Zoning Adjustment, shall constitute a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, is punishable by a fine of not more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) or imprisonment for a period of not more than thirty (30) days, or both. Each day that such a violation continues to exist shall be considered as a separate offense subject to penalty as specified herein.

(12) **Sec. 18-3. Violation and penalties. (Article I, Construction Code)**

Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this code shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and each such person shall be deemed guilty of a separate offense for each and every day or portion thereof during which any violation of any of the provisions of this code is committed, continued or permitted, and upon

conviction of any such violation, such person shall be punishable by a fine of not more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) or by imprisonment for not more than ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

(13) **Sec. 18-5. Amendments to the Electrical Code.**

(12) Violations and penalties. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to erect, construct, enlarge, alter, repair, move, improve, remove, convert or demolish, equip, use, occupy or maintain any building or structure in the Town or cause or permit the same to be done contrary to or in violation of any or the provisions of this code. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this code shall be deemed guilty of a separate offense for each and every day or portion thereof during which any violation of any of the provisions of this code is committed, continued or permitted, and, upon conviction of any such violation, such person shall be punishable by a fine of not more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) or by imprisonment for not more than ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

(14) **Sec. 18-63. Penalties for violations. (Article IV, Fire Prevention Code)**

Any person, firm or corporation violating any provision of the Uniform Fire Code and amendments thereto or any other provisions of this Chapter shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor. Upon conviction of each such violation such person shall be punished by a fine of not more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00), or by imprisonment for not more than ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Each person shall be deemed guilty of a separate offense for each and every day or portion thereof during which any violation of any the provisions of the Uniform Fire Code and amendments thereto is committed, continued or permitted

Section 7. Additions or amendments to the Code, when passed in the form as to indicate the intention of the Town to make the same a part of the Code, shall be deemed to be incorporated in the Code, so that reference to the Code includes the additions and amendments.

Section 8. Ordinances adopted after December 30, 1991, that amend or refer to ordinances that have been codified in the Code, shall be construed as if they amend or refer to those provisions of the Code.

Section 9. The Board of Trustees herewith finds, determines and declares that this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety in order to make this ordinance applicable to the Town at the earliest possible date so that administrative efficiency may be obtained therefrom and to assure that the purposes of this Ordinance are met. This Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after publication thereof.
